Quality and Rarity Report

This is to attest that the undersigned were privileged to carefully and thoroughly examine a magnificent Burmese ruby of 8.05 cts

Colour Bright red, characteristic hue and lively brilliance of the rarest rubies from Mogok (Burma, Myanmar).

Transparency Very high transparency in all different viewing
Clarity directions. Eye clean.

Microscopic examination The ruby is characterized by extremely delicate silk inclusions, not visible to the naked eye, which corroborate the origin to be Myanmar (Burma) and that this precious gemstone was in no way treated.

Rarity

The vast majority of faceted Burmese rubies from Mogok (Myanmar) are enhanced for color and clarity by heat. The very fine ruby of 8.05cts is one of the few exceptional cases of superior quality not belonging to this group of gemstones. The nature of the material is of such a standard that no further enhancement is necessary. Therefore, and regarding the size and quality of this jewel, it can be placed in the highest rarity category possible: It is a unique specimen.
